Adoption of Inter-municipal Sewer Collaboration Feasibility Study

WHEREAS: The Shared Municipal Services Initiative Grant Program [SMSI] was established in the New York State Budget to provide technical assistance and competitive grants to local governments for the development of projects that will achieve savings and improve municipal efficiency through shared services, cooperative agreements, mergers, consolidations and dissolutions; and

WHEREAS: This funding source, along with contributions from the participating municipalities (Town and Village of Nichols, Town and Village of Owego and Village of Waverly) funded the Inter-municipal Sewer Collaboration Feasibility Study; and

WHEREAS: Hunt Engineering was hired to conduct the study and a study committee formed consisting of the WWTP operators and municipal representatives from each participating committee; and

WHEREAS: Said study has been completed, presented to each participating municipal board and made the following recommendations:

- **While combining or consolidating the 3 Owego wastewater treatment plants is NOT feasible at this time due to inflow and infiltration problems as well as the high capital expense of a new facility, it should be a long-term goal when appropriate funding becomes available; and**
- **While expansion of the Lounsberry wastewater treatment plant down East River Road to include sewage service for the Village of Nichols is NOT financially feasible, some limited expansion of the Lounsberry sewage district is critical to add more users to the system and establish a financially feasible user rate; and**
- **If the Village of Owego moves forward with the compost facility as an alternative to sludge disposal, then they should execute the shared agreement with the Village of Waverly and the Town of Owego if a cost savings can be realized.**
- **Each municipality needs to establish a capital improvement fund that is more aligned with EPA guidelines concerning asset management to be able to more efficiently replace aged/broken equipment and other sewer infrastructure now and in the future; and**
- **An Inter-municipal Technical Sewer Committee should be established to continuously exchange current information on hot items or critical issues that could help each individual municipality or be addressed on an inter-municipal basis; and**
- **A longer term goal should be to create a Centralized Inter-municipal Sewer District should be established to centralize administration and other operations of the various districts along the Susquehanna River.**

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT

Trustee Clark,

A couple of months ago we learned that the Village of Owego planned to sell effluent to Inflection Energy, LLC, a gas exploration company. This was discussed at several Village Board meetings and in a few newspaper articles, but the Village Residents and the Village Taxpayers have been given limited information beyond the exciting news that the Village will receive \$36Million Dollars for a 10 year contract.

This appears to be a wonderful opportunity for the Village. I believe we should protect it, and I want to understand what will be expected of the Village in exchange for this considerable sum of money.

I can't speak for other Village Taxpayers, but to date, I have received very little specific information about the proposed contract with Inflection Energy, LLC and no information about the company.

I am not aware of any open discussions about the affects of this contract on Village residents, especially those living in Hallstead or along Southside Drive.

I have not heard any discussion of how much it will cost the Village to prepare for this contract, or how the Village plans to finance any up-front expense for this contract. What is the Village business plan for this new Village business?

Revised 2-22-10

When will the Village receive the first payment from Inflection, and how much per month?

I have heard no discussion about the level of Village or Taxpayer liability in this business deal. Is there a limit to the Village's liability? Are the individual Village Taxpayers also liable? If so, to what extent? Can a third party sue the Village or the Village Taxpayers for damages related to the use of the effluent the Village sells?

Questions about the Inflection Energy, LLC application for Surface Water Withdrawal from the Susquehanna River at the Village of Owego Sewer Plant have also been brushed aside at Village Board Meetings, and there has been no coverage of this important item in newspaper articles.

Will the Village be compensated for this water withdrawal, and how does this relate to the contract with Inflection energy, LLC for effluent purchase from the Village of Owego Sewer Plant?

Village Residents and Village Taxpayers can benefit from this contract, but they will also be expected to tolerate the negative effects. I am not aware of any balanced public discussion of these issues. Please stop contract negotiations between the Village and Inflection until these discussions are complete.

Perhaps you already answered these questions about the contract's benefits and negative effects. If you have, please take the time needed to share this information with the Village Taxpayers and Residents, so we can understand how you will arrive at your decision on this contract. Your decision will affect each of us for quite a long time. We are all in this together, and we all want a decision we can support.

Some Questions - Regarding The Village Of Owego Contract With Inflection Energy, LLC

Village of Owego Taxpayers and Residents have been prevented from reading the proposed contract with Inflection Energy, LLC, and have been given little or no information about the company.

1) How will this contract affect Village Residents?

When water is drawn at the maximum rate, a truck will leave the Village Sewer Plant every 6 minutes.

A) West bound trucks will drive from the Village Sewer Plant to the Route 17 entrance across from Hallstead. How do the Southside Drive and Hallstead Residents feel about this traffic?

B) North bound trucks will drive across the bridge and through the Village. The rest of us?

2) Please tell us about some of features of the contract between Inflection and the Village of Owego:

A) Can Inflection **sell the effluent** or the **surface water** withdrawn from the Susquehanna River at the Village of Owego Sewer Plant to another company or municipality?

B) Can Inflection **sell this contract** for effluent, between Inflection and the Village of Owego, to another company or municipality?

C) If Inflection sells the contract to another company, can that company withdraw surface water from the Susquehanna River at the Village of Owego Sewer Plant

D) Under this contract, can the Village of Owego sell effluent to another company, or make surface water withdrawn from the Susquehanna River at the Village of Owego Sewer Plant available to another company?

3) What are the financial details?

A) How much it will cost the Village to prepare for this contract? Please list the up-front costs.

B) How will the Village finance the up-front expense for this contract? Loans? Increased Taxes?

C) When will the Village receive the first payment from Inflection? How much will we receive?

D) How much will the Village receive per month for the effluent for the life of the contract?

E) How much will the Village receive per month for the river water for the life of the contract?

4) What is the extent of the Village liability when it sells effluent? Does it exceed \$36 Million?

Mayor Arrington, Trustees, and Interested Parties,

It is my position that Transload Solutions LLC, in seeking to greatly expand its business, needs to consider to its impact on the health and welfare of the residents of Owego. The type of sand transferred and stored by this industry, crystalline silica, is of the size that increases residents' risk of lung cancer, silicosis, and other respiratory diseases as well as risk to kidneys, immune-function, eyesight, and other chronic illnesses. This industry is controversial anywhere, but it is particularly appalling that this heavy industry is adjacent to a residential area right here in the village of Owego.

You may also wish to note that New York physicians are becoming more vocal on the risks of hydraulic fracturing:


December 10, 2010:

RESOLVED, That the Medical Society of the State of New York supports a moratorium on natural gas extraction using high volume hydraulic fracturing in New York State until valid information is available to evaluate the process for its potential effects on human health and the environment.

June 7, 2010

The American Academy of Pediatrics, District II, NYS, representing more than 6,000 pediatricians and the millions of children we care for across the state, strongly supports A10940/S7592: An act to establish a moratorium on conducting hydraulic fracturing for extraction of natural gas or oil in New York State until 120 days after the Environmental Protection Agency issues a report on the effects of hydraulic fracturing on water quality, air quality and other public health impacts.

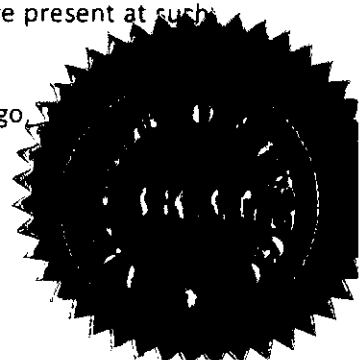
